

For the 119th Congress, Starting in January 2025, the Republican will control both the U.S. House of Representatives and the United States Senate.

The House Ways and Means Committee Organization & Leadership:

- Republican will control 26 seats on the W&M Committee
- Congressman Jason Smith, R-Missouri will serve as Committee Chairman
- 22 of the Republican Members who served on W&M in the 118th Congress will serve on the Committee in 2025
- Four new Republican Members have been added to the Committee:
 - Rep. Aaron Bean, Florida 4th Congressional District (Clay, Nassau & Duval Counties)
 - Rep. Max Miller, Ohio 7th Congressional District (Parma, Medina & Wooster)

 - Rep. Rudy Yakym, Indiana 2nd Congressional District (South Bend & Kokomo)
